

The Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes region is a stronghold for agri-food businesses due to its natural resources, its significant number of consumers (a population of 8 million, France's second most densely populated region) and a strategic geographical situation, bolstered by major communication infrastructure.



SPECIFIC FEATURES AND STRENGTHS OF THE SECTOR

The region is at the forefront of three industries: **meat, dairy and beverages.** These **three sectors account for almost 54% of salaried jobs** in the sector within the region, of which 24% for the meat sector alone.

Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes is the leading producer of dry curing. With an annual output of 130,000 tonnes, it **ranks third for the production of charcuterie.**

The beverage sector is singled out by the presence of some of the main **French mineral** water springs (Vichy, Evian, Volvic, Badoit), as well as world-renowned wine production (Côtes du Rhône, Beaujolais).

Agriculture also has a strong presence in the region; its 3 million hectares of arable land rank it 4th in France. It has **54,000 farms**, which account for some **102,000 workers in permanent employment**.

The organic produce industry has strong growth in the two départements of Drôme and Ardèche, with **5,380 producers working with organic practices.**

Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes has an abundance of specialities: **wine** what with the Côtes du Rhône and Beaujolais, **pasta** with crozets and others, Auvergne **cheeses**, water, olives and more

In all, 77 PDOs and 59 PGIs are registered in the territory.

Furthermore, Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes is ranked **third region in France** in terms of numbers of manufacturers making animal feed.

Lastly, the energy bar market for sportspeople is experiencing strong growth in the region, with a growing number of players on this niche.

Training centres educate future employees of the sector at every level and throughout the territory:

- O the universities of Clermont-Ferrand, Lyon and Grenoble,
- the engineering schools ISARA, VetAgroSup and AgroParisTech.

There are also many training courses through apprenticeship and a network of 120 agricultural colleges (Les Sardières in Bourg-en-Bresse O1, La Martellière in Voiron 38, La Rochefort-Montagne 63, etc.)
